## Racing with BABA in 2006

By now you must be itching for those sensations of the wind in your face, the horn blasts influencing your heart rate, the friendly bumping as you jockey for position at the start, and that elated feeling of rounding the last mark and heading for the finish line. For the coming season, we'll continue to provide you with the opportunity get out on the water with a bunch of like-minded people and have fun sailing around the buoys.

This year the series will have eight events. We'll start out on May 21, with the Gerry Brown Memorial Regatta at Rocky Point, courtesy of the Baltimore County Sailing Center. We will be joined on the course by dingy sailors from their club. This will be our annual fundraiser for cancer research as well as an interesting start of the series. Bring the family and sail a dingy. Next, on June 10 and 11, we race, eat, party and campout for two days at the Gunpowder. This is also a Mid-Atlantic Series event so that means there will be lots of folks from out of town, too. Later, on June 25, we descend upon Mayo Beach Park in Mayo, MD, for another BABA / MAS race. This will give every one an opportunity to check out the park, have lunch from the Selby Sub Shop, and sample the sweet sailing to be had there. We wind up on July 16, at the Gunpowder in time for those nice afternoon thermals.

Take the month of August off to rest up for the Hart / Miller Island Rounding in September. Here, we're invited by the Baltimore County Sailing Center to join their fleet in their annual race around Hart / Miller Island. This is a long distance race with about 11 miles to cover. A fun event with plenty of chase boats but, historically, no wind. Maybe this will be the year.... Mid month we'll celebrate the chili harvest on September 17, at the Gunpowder. Nothing like racing with a good chili burn going, anticipating that salty margarita waiting back on the beach. At the end of September, the 30th to be exact, we return to Mayo Beach to host the two day East Coast Formula

Championships / BABA / MAS Blowout Regatta. Wow, not only was that a mouthful, it's big all around. This is a sanctioned regatta of the US Windsurfing National Race Tour. If you attended last year you know about the killer food we had catered in the park facilities, the wind on the course for all classes, the Clipper City keg, camping on the beach, late night videos, police protection, coffee, muffins and fruit delivered for breakfast, more wind on the course for all classes, the Clipper City keg, the awards with cake. Cake. We're working on all that and more this year.

To pull a schedule like this off, we need help from club members as well as the racing community. Volunteering for registration, committee boat, and food prep, etc., is essential to a successful event. Much praise and adulation is heaped on the folks who cheerfully volunteer. The volunteer sign-up sheet will be at the registration table.

As you check out the Series N.O.R. and Sailing Instructions that are conveniently posted on our most excellent web site, you will notice a few changes have taken place. In particular, we have homogenized the fleets to get more of you on the starting line and streamline some sparsely populated classes.

The first start will be the Formula Fleet. This fleet will be comprised of Formula 31 (3 sails, 1 board), and Sport Formula (any wide board without a daggerboard, any sail) for a less intense race experience or training for 31 class.

The second start will be the Longboard Fleet (any board with a daggerboard). Here we have 7.5 Limited, Women's 7.5 Limited, and Open Unlimited. For the third, or possibly a separate start we'll be working with first time racers and juniors on a short, easy course designed to build basic skills needed to confidently get out there and compete. Make it your goal

to get somebody new involved in our racing program this year.

You may also notice that we will be using a different scoring system for the series. It is well explained there and on the US Sailing website referenced. Bottom line is that it rewards participation and large turnouts.

That's enough reading for sure. Now let's get out and do it. Let's have 40 of us show up at the season opener and keep the momentum going all summer. Don't forget to keep checking our especially cool website for updates or last minute announcements.

senger side mirror as the view is blocked in the rear view mirror. The passenger sits behind the driver in back seat. Not pretty but it works. We unload and repack into respective vehicles. By this time folks in the Double T have sent an emissary out to find out what the heck we are doing! When we finally go in for breakfast we have to answer quite a few excited queries before we can be seated. Sadly, I don't think our antics recruited any future windsurfers, the general feeling seemed to be that we were interesting, but maybe a touch mad.

The drive to Florida was pretty painless. Got into Amber's dad's place in time to find food, eat, soak in the hot tub, and get a good night's sleep. After a bike ride to the Atlantic through a beautiful wildlife refuge on Friday morning we made our way to Kelly Park. Found our welcoming contingent of BABA and WET sailors, parked next to them, and caught up what they had been doing all week (wind was good at times, often fluky or gusty but consensus was that warm temps trumped being in Maryland or Virginia any day). Only the A fleet was racing Friday, so we rigged and played. Luckily, there is security on site, so we were able to unload the car and leave all the equipment at the park overnight.

Saturday dawns, and the wind she is a blowing. Every one is jazzed. The A fleet

starts at 10. Skippers meeting for B fleet at 10. Many people voice some confusion about the course. Amber finds a permanent marker and copies the course on her arm. The B hybrid fleet is starting with the A hybrid fleet. The meaning of this dawns on me only when I get out to the start line (which is as John Quinn notes, perhaps the furthest from shore start line we will ever experience). I can't find members of my fleet in amongst the Olympic RSX and A Fleet Prodigy folks- I sail on, figuring I'll find my course eventually—sadly, everyone in my fleet is as confused as I am- I'm not sure any of us actually found the course in the first race. One guy in our fleet thought the finish line was a gate, and the committee boat scored him as first through! It was kind of comical. I finally decided it was a nice day to sail, went around a few A fleet bouys and then went back to shore. Amber had a much better day in her B formula fleet, glad to finally have a fleet on the same equipment as she. Even when the wind picked up big time in the afternoon, she gutted it out and sailed the course.

On Sunday the winds were much lighter, so much that the A Formula fleet never left shore, which I am sure was quite disappointing to them. My moment of personal triumph came Sunday when I actually found and sailed the B fleet course. Amber's came when she got called up to claim her plaque for coming in 3rd.

Altogether there were about 140 participants! This included: 11 pros, 18 RSX, 17 kids, and all the rest of us.

It was a very cool experience. There were so many incredibly good sailors— there were a bunch of folks training for the Olympics on their RSX boards,

including our own **Farrah Hall**. (who is still needing donations for her Olympic bid. Make your tax deductible donation to: Farrah Hall 2006 Olympic Windsurfing Campaign, C/O US Windsurfing, PO Box 99, Chelsea MI 48118). These women sail big sails (8.5) in all conditions—very gutsy
